(This is an article I wrote on my Blog on April 10th.)



As we sing, I usually put my hands on everyone in the room pleading the blood of Jesus and believing the healing power of God is flowing through their bodies. This morning I kept being drawn to her. Every time I walked by

her, I would touch her and speak to her as though she could hear me. After the service was over I got close to her face and said, "I am assuming you can hear me. If you can, blink your eyes faster." She did! Then I asked her to smile. I could tell she was trying. Now I'm starting to cry for joy. I told her I would be back and I would like to work with her more. I asked her if that would be okay? Her mouth moved. I had never seen her do any of this before. So I put my ear close to her mouth and asked her again if she would like me to work with her. She said, "ya."
