Thursday - December 10th



It was so good to see residents again. There were more residents coming into the room than normal. It's obvious that the shutdown is affecting more and more people. Loneliness is becoming a huge issue. They are starving for fellowship. I am ministering from the outside of the building and they are inside with an open door between us. I understand they need to be protected. I just hope

the solution is not worse than the problem. We sang the familiar Christmas carols for close to an hour. They were so happy again. It was a joy to be together.

This happened on December 10th, a very special day in my life. It's my dad's birthday. He is 105 today. (I would imagine he is celebrating with mom in heaven.) When I was in high school back in the 60's, I remember experiencing a nursing home with him for the first time. It was a definite landmark in my life and helped guide me to where I am today.

Last month I wrote:

James 1:27 "Pure and lasting religion in the sight of God our Father means that we must care for orphans and widows in their troubles. . ." NLT

I understand that to mean those who are alone and without family. I find many of these people in nursing care facilities and on the streets - the homeless.

This year has been an unprecedented year. We have all had unexpected challenges. However, I believe the best is yet to come for ministry opportunities. I am in the middle of a ministry opportunity for the homeless. I believe it will be something I can start the first of 2021. I'm hoping I will be able to share more about it in my year-end letter.

Well here we are, year-end. On the next page is my vision for 2021.

- **Maintain a prayer perimeter around Rhema.**

Just as past evangelists had prayer warriors go before them to pray over the cities and peoples they would be ministering to, the Lord has directed me to go into the counties surrounding Rhema and pray for 3 specific areas: Protection – Power – Persistence.

- **Minister in nursing and assisted care facilities throughout eastern Oklahoma.**

Since November of 2009 we have been ministering in nursing care facilities. Back when we started we were living in Gore, Oklahoma and traveling in a 50 mile radius of home. Since then we moved to Tulsa and continued to travel throughout eastern Oklahoma. From time to time we make changes to the schedule and mix of the nursing care facilities. However, this has been the foundational mandate of this ministry. We have ministered in 71 nursing care facilities in the last 11 years. We will continue to minister as the Lord leads.

- **Develop a stronger ministry to the homeless.**



In 2019 and 2020 I developed a ministry to the homeless. This ministry grew out of seeing the homeless while riding my bike. I saw them under bridges, in wooded areas, on street corners, etc. I ministered from my bike and utilized many ways to

carry supplies with me as I rode. I ministered to many, but it seemed like I could never carry enough for the demand on my bike.

It's time to take this ministry to a new level.

Toward the end of 2020 I reached out to another ministry in Tulsa. The **John 3:16 Mission** is an organization that does a tremendous work with the homeless. I have taken a tour of their facility and have been vetted to be a volunteer. They would like me to minister in their chapel services and be part of a team called “search and rescue”. This is a team of people who go directly to the homeless and help in any way they can, with a focus on sharing the Good News of Jesus. I'm excited to get started in 2021.

- **Help Pastors and Churches in the eastern Oklahoma area.**

From time to time I have had the opportunity to help both pastors and churches through some difficult/transition times. As these situations arise, I will continue to make myself available.
